

Check Your House for Safety



Take safety measures inside and outside of your home regularly to prepare for sudden disaster.

Out-side

If you have concerns about your residency's earthquake-resistance, have it earthquake-resistance tested and reinforced.

※ Houses built before May 31st, 1981 may be have less earthquake-resistance.

✓ Check!

Blocks / Fences

Make sure there are no cracks, damage, or wobbling.

✓ Check!

Balcony

Always keep neat and organized.

✓ Check!

Propane Gas Cylinders

Make sure they are firmly fixed.

Roof / TV antenna



Cracks, gaps, and detachment should be reinforced. Make sure the TV antenna is stable.

Window glass



Spread film on windows to prevent shattering.

Around the entrance



Always keep area neat and organized in case you need to escape quickly.

Safety Measures in Collective Housing

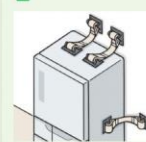
Emergency Doors/ Disaster Prevention Equipment

Don't leave things in front of emergency doors where they might prevent escape. Confirm the location of emergency equipment (fire extinguisher, fire alarms, etc.)

In-side

During earthquakes, many injuries are caused by falling furniture. Also, too much clutter may prevent an easy escape. Rearrange and fix furniture. Take safety measures.

Refrigerator



Fix to the wall with a belt, stopper, etc.

TV / PC



Place at lower locations and affix with sticker mats, etc.

Heaters



Keep flammables away.

Fix with brackets and spread non-slip sheets or cloths on shelves. Place stoppers underneath and put film on door glass to prevent from shattering.

✓ Check!

Props

Fix tall furniture and bookshelves to the wall with brackets or props. Put heavy things on lower shelves and lighter things on the upper.

✓ Check!

Place furniture away from entrances and sleeping places.

✓ Check!

Use fireproof curtains and bedding.

✓ Check!

Don't put fragile or breakable things on top of furniture.

✓ Check!

Place shoes in an easy to reach location to prevent stepping on broken glass.

✓ Check!

Put stoppers under furniture to prevent them from falling.

Door stoppers (for dish shelves)

✓ Check!

Special Allowances and Support:

- Allowance system for evaluation of seismic capacity for wooden houses
- Allowance system for wooden houses to improve anti-seismic structure
- Support project for setting up furniture fall prevention devices
- Allowance system for condominium anti-seismic structure improvements
